INDEPENDENT INSPECTION AND AUDIT REPORT

In accordance with your instructions we have performed an independent audit on Silver Investment Coins & Bars held by AuCOFFRE.com / LinGOLD.com / LingORO.com. AuCOFFRE is the unique provider for VeraCash, its affiliate. Therefore, all VeraCash products are kept by AuCOFFRE and in AuCOFFRE's safes. Our findings are as follows:

Principle

The principle of this audit was to confirm that items of silver stored by Members of AuCOFFRE.com / LinGOLD.com/ LingORO.com are physically present in their specified vault and correspond to their individual specifications.

Aim

To provide total reassurance to members that their silver exists and is stored correctly in a suitable environment to ensure maximum security and ideal conditions of conservation that maintain the quality and condition of items stored.

The Vaults / Storage

Geneva Freeport, La Praille

Situated in the Geneva Freeport secure facility they contain a variety of gold bullion, silver bullion, gold coins, silver coins and diamonds which are stored on behalf of members.

Access to the vaults is strictly controlled by on site security systems. Only verified staff members are allowed entry and visits need to be planned in order to make the necessary security arrangements.

The vaults are under permanent video & electronic surveillance as well as human guards.

Within the vaults the coins & bars were stored in cabinets and boxes, packaged in various materials i.e. plastic packaging, plastic tubes, paper, wooden crates and durable cardboard boxes.



Bordeaux

Situated in a privately owned site in the Bordeaux area they contain a variety of gold bullion, gold and silver coins which are stored on behalf of members. Access is strictly controlled by onsite staff. Coins were stored securely and packaged either in new cardboard boxes from the supplier or in plastic casing for long term storage and protection.

The Method

An audit of the full silver inventory was carried out. Auditors were presented with the stock list for the silver inventory and were required to check that all silver on the list was present. Due to the extensive number of silver coins stored within the vaults, sample boxes and packets were selected for thorough checking as counting each individual silver coin was not feasible given the volume of silver coins at both sites. If the number of coins contained within the sample container per group was verified this was assumed to be the case for the remaining containers in that specific group. Further details can be found below.

Many of the boxes/packets containing silver coins/ingots had also been sealed with tamper proof tape during the previous audit and therefore, did not require a recheck.

Vera Silver Zanzibar, Bordeaux, not held in customs, stored in 36 groups containing various numbers of coins. The physical count of 2820 coins was found to be a perfect match with the stock list. One coin from each group was checked against the internal database. Group 6014 consisted of 45 coins in a zip locked bag. These coins did not have references engraved.

In total there were **2820 Zanzibar coins** counted. See Appendix FRANCE 1.

Vera Silver Gibraltar – Bordeaux Safe 1 – 439 coins were counted and matched with the back office record. One coin from each album reference was checked and confirmed.

France Argent - Bordeaux safe 2 - Plastic wallets containing 114 silver coins were also found in Bordeaux under album references 3017/6499/6500/6501.

Vera Silver Gibraltar – Bordeaux Safe 3 – For Albums References 6475, 6560 and 6996 the coin amounts represent individual references (1945 references in total). All numbers matched the back office and three references were checked (1 from each Album). 1705 further coins were counted and one piece from each album verified against the back office.

Philharmonique de Vienne and Maple Leaf coins – Bordeaux Safe 4. 3 boxes of 20 tubes and 1 box of 10 tubes of Maple Leaf and 1 box of Philharmonique de Vienne with 15 tubes giving 85 coins in total.

50F Hercule silver coins, All coins remained closed behind a screen sealed with integrity tape from the 2017 audit. Total coins are assumed to be accurate. Total, 5000 coins. See appendix Geneva - SWISS NON-CUSTOMS LSP SILVER.

10F Hercule silver coins, Geneva, LSP, not held in customs. All coins remained closed behind a screen sealed with integrity tape from the 2017 audit. Total coins are assumed to be accurate. Total, 6,000 coins. See appendix Geneva - SWISS NON-CUSTOMS LSP SILVER.

5F Semeuses silver coins, Geneva, LSP, not held in customs. All coins remained closed behind a screen sealed with integrity tape from the 2017 audit. Total coins are assumed to be accurate. Total, 29,000 coins. See appendix Geneva - SWISS NON-CUSTOMS LSP SILVER.



Wiener Philharmoniker 1oz Coins - Geneva, LSP, not held in customs. 146 Grey boxes said to contain Wiener Philharmoniker were counted in Vault D42. ALS opened a box with barcode 730820, reference written 110123. In this box ALS found 25 tubes. One tube was opened finding 20 coins - 1.50 Euro coins of Wiener Philharmoniker for a total of 500 coins in the box. The box was sealed with A123832.

Maple Leaf 1 ounce silver coins - Geneva, LSP, not held in customs. 20 yellow boxes said to contain Maple Leaf coins were counted in Vault D42. ALS opened box 4159 which contained 20 tubes of 25 coins (opened tube number 74041019 - Maple leaf silver coins found inside) resealed with new seals A123832.

Britannia 1 ounce silver coins, Geneva, LSP, not held in customs, were in one lot containing 10 packets of 100 coins - in total 1000 coins. The coins remained sealed behind a screen so were not verified during this audit. All seals were observed to be intact. See appendix Geneva - SWISS NON-CUSTOMS LSP SILVER.

Vera Silver 1 ounce silver coins, Geneva, held in customs were said to be (as per the paperwork) in 3 batches - batch 1 supplied by Huguenin, batch 2 supplied by BHMRYER and batch 3 supplied by Pichard Balme (Saumur - FR).

The auditor was shown to the vaults containing the silver coins held in taped, brown cardboard boxes. 298 boxes in total observed to be in Vault E45 along with 2 sealed crates with seals intact from previous audits. In vault E46 798 boxes were observed. Checks on two boxes were performed. Box reference 243045 was opened and checked with 250 silver coins found present. The box was resealed with ALS seal A123832.

Box 6021 (refs 76122300 - 76122349) was opened with 500 coins found. This box was also resealed with ALS seal A123832.

Silver Ingots (Vera Silver 999)

During the 2017 audit, 9 crates of silver ingots were verified and sealed with integrity tape. We confirm that the tape remains intact for each crate. Details of the bars can be found in the appendix - SWISS IN-CUSTOMS SILVER INGOTS.
